- 6 The government passes a bill to cut taxes today and finance it with cuts to government expenditures in the future. How does your answer compare to the previous question? What explains the difference?
- 7 Suppose it is expected that energy prices will increase in the future. If true, this will have a negative effect on businesses' productivity.
